HYGIENIC RULES OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

"Crisis and the State. On the example of Czechoslovakia in the Interwar Period"
held on the 23rd and 24th of September 2021

in the National Archives Cinema

- 1) **Only persons** who have presented a **non-infection document to the organisers** will be allowed into the Cinema:
 - a) **proof of a test not older than 72 hours in the case of a POC antigen test, or not older than 7 days in the case of a RT-PCR test, or**
 - b) **certificate of vaccination completed at least 14 days ago, or**
 - c) **confirmation that no more than 180 days have passed from the first positive test for coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 (for more details see ref. no. MZDR 14601/2021-22/MIN/KAN).**
- 2) **Persons who show clinical symptoms of Covid-19 are prohibited from participating.**
- 3) **Persons without respirators of class FFP2 and KN95 or higher, or other similarly effective protective equipment, will not be allowed to enter.**
- 4) **Before entering** the hall, all persons will **wash their hands in disinfectant.**
- 5) The number of participants in the hall (speakers and listeners together) will not exceed **100 persons.**
- 6) Visitors are asked to **sit separately** and not congregate.
- 7) Visitors are asked to **limit handshakes.**
- 8) **Speakers do not have to wear respirators when presenting their contributions**, but the lectern and the metal microphone will be disinfected after every speech. After changes of the notebook operator and the chairs of individual blocks, their places will also be disinfected.
- 9) **Contributions during the discussion will be presented with respirators**, so that the portable microphones will not have to be wiped down after every speaker; however, they will also be regularly disinfected.
- 10) **Refreshments** will be served exclusively **packaged**, and participants are asked to **stand apart when consuming them.**

A failure to respect the afore-mentioned rules will result in termination of participation in the conference.
